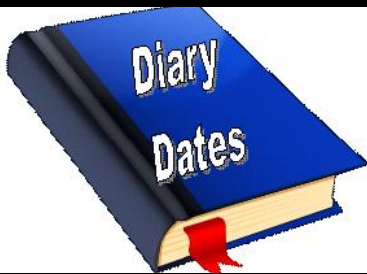

Miss Lewis is very impressed. We need to increase the attendance to **94%** for next week.

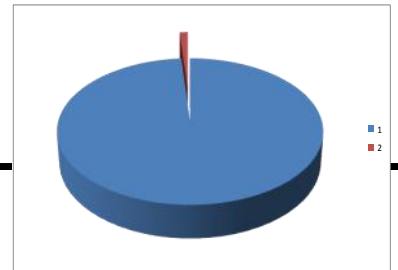
