



## World Book Day

## Privacy Notice - How we use your information (The Play Development Service)



Calderdale Council of Town Hall, Crossley Street, Halifax, HX1 1UJ, is registered with the information Commissioners Office (ICO) under the provisions of the Data Protection Act 2018. The Council takes its responsibilities under the Act very seriously.



The information provided by you is collected purely for the purposes of providing you with access to the Play Development Service open access play provision as you have requested. We need to collect this information in order to manage the effective provision of this service. Completion of this form/sharing your information with us constitutes explicit consent from you for us to process your data for this purpose. Processing is necessary for compliance with a legal obligation under "The Children and Families Act 2014" "working together safeguarding children 2018".



Processing of special category data is necessary for protecting the vital interests of the data subject and for the provision of health or social care or treatment and the management of health and social care systems and services.



You have the right to see what information is held about you, to have inaccurate information corrected, to restrict processing and to have information removed from our system unless we are required by law or a statutory purpose to keep it by contacting the Operations Manager - CMBC Young Peoples Service, Orange Box Halifax, 1 Blackledge, Halifax, HX1 1AF or on 01422 433200.



You have the right to complain to the Data Protection Officer if you feel that your/ your child's data has not been handled in accordance with the law. We will not share your information without your consent. The Council's Data Protection Officer is Tracie Robinson and can be contacted at [information\\_management@calderdale.gov.uk](mailto:information_management@calderdale.gov.uk).



You also have the right to lodge a complaint with the Information Commissioner's Office at [www.ico.org.uk](http://www.ico.org.uk).



Your/your child's information will be kept for a maximum of 5 years if you are accessing the universal play provision, 5 years if you are accessing the short breaks play provision and child's DOB plus 35 years if you are accessing the SEN commission session. If your child is in an accident or incident within a session with the Play Development service, the accident/incident record will be held for DOB +21 years. This is after the date you cease using the service or until such time as the data is reviewed by us or removed at your request.



The Play Development Service provides free open access play sessions for children and young people aged between 5-14 years old. The sessions are open access and are offered at various centres, parks and open spaces across Calderdale. We provide a range of activities that are chosen by children and young people; these can sometimes get messy, so please come in clothes that are appropriate for the activity and the weather. We aim for all our activities to be inclusive to all children and young people.
