


Shape of the Week - Heptagon

Heptagon is a **polygon** (a closed shape made up of 3 or more line segments) made up of 7 sides and 7 angles.

The word heptagon is made up of two words, hepta meaning seven and gon meaning sides




Year 6 SATs Treat

Times Tables Tea Party




Year 4 children and their parents had a fantastic afternoon on Wednesday when they took part in the Times Tables Tea Party.

Suncream
